The couple settled into a house in Norris City. Kenneth worked as a truck driver in the oil fields and traveled quite a bit. Margaret went with him to Texas, West Virginia and Kentucky. She enjoyed getting to travel with him. In 1953, Ronnie was born and Margaret stopped traveling and moved a short distance away to Carmi, IL. Cindy was born in 1957. Shortly thereafter, Kenneth quit working in the oil fields. He worked as a custodian and a mail carrier.

Margaret stayed at home and took care of the children. She worked as a volunteer in their schools and was a Den Mother for Ronnie's Boy Scout troop. As a family, they were actively involved in the Methodist church.

In April of 1970, Kenneth passed away due to a brain tumor. Ronnie was 17 and Cindy was 13. They tried to continue cleaning the building where Kenneth was the custodian, but it was too much for them. Even though she hadn't liked school as a child, Margaret chose to back to school while she continued to raise her two teenage children. She attended a two year program in Harrisburg, IL, to become an LPN. Upon graduation, she went to work for a nursing home in Carmi, IL.

Margaret used to love to read, go for walks, and fish. She still loves to play games, especially Rummikub. She's been on several bus tours with her best friend to places such as Washington, D.C. during cherry blossom season, to the Grand Ole Opry in Nashville, TN, and to Branson. She also has made several trips to see her grandchildren over the years.

In 2009, Margaret broke her hip. Cindy stayed with her for a while and they decided it was time for her to move closer to Cindy. Cindy and her husband, Larry, live in Trimble and so Margaret moved to an apartment in nearby Smithville.

However in January of 2016, Cindy's son is getting married. So there is hope for more great grandchildren.
