In her career as a nurse, Marjorie worked with polio patients, hot packs and iron lungs. She then worked in obstetrics and pediatrics before she started working in industrial nursing. She worked in this field until she retired in 1990.

Marjorie was very involved in her sons' lives. She was a den mother and Boy Scout leader. She helped them all obtain their Eagle Scout ranking. She is very proud of her sons. Her two oldest sons became machinists and Daniel was a heavy equipment operator.

Marjorie has known her share of sadness. Her husband passed away in 1972 due to an infection. This was a difficult time for her. Her son, Daniel, was diagnosed with prostate cancer.
